HOST COURSE

All tournament and practice rounds will be played at Swan Lake Resort's Black Course. This par 72 layout measures 7,112 yards and has a 74.2 rating and a 129 slope.

The golf club offers the most complete practice area in Northern Indiana with the largest practice tee, complete short game practice area, and numerous practice greens.

POST-CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS

- Awards shall be given to the first, second, and third place teams.
- Each individual golfer on the first-place team shall receive an NJCAA gold medal. There shall be eight (8) medals.
- Each individual golfer on the second-place team shall receive an NJCAA silver medal. There shall be eight (8) medals.
- Silver and bronze medals will be awarded the second and third place finishers, respectively.
- Medalist Award (plaque) shall be presented.
- Coach of the Tournament Award shall be presented.
- The top-18 finishers shall be presented medals and site hole flags in recognition of their finish. These golfers will be designated as the All-Tournament Team. The United States Golf Association collegiate tie-breaking procedure will be used to break all ties within the top-18 finishers.

TOURNAMENT DEADLINES

See and follow the forms section below on the process of getting your team/individual registered and for complete details on all fees associated with the event, but here is a quick breakdown:

The tournament Entry Fee is \$1500 per team and \$250 per individual and includes:

- All practice rounds, tournament rounds, Coaches Cart each practice and tournament round, complimentary Official Championship Favor and Program, on-site practice facility use on tournament days only and food on the last day of the event



The following additional expenses are the responsibility of the team, these may be purchased separately or together with all other fees either in advance, upon arrival or prior to departure depending on what is convenient for your school are:

FORMS

All forms are mandatory prior to arrival

- All forms (1-5) must be filled out and submitted to Chad Hutsell by May 11, 2026.
- No payments will be required to be made in advance, only completion and submission of all proper forms by the 5/11/26 deadline. The school may determine how they wish to pay for the event. Payment in full will be required prior to departure.
 - Upon arrival, each school will be set up with a "House Account" where event event-related charge will be applied throughout the event.
 - Payment for charges placed on the House Account can be made in cash, check, or credit card per the school's preference.
- If your school requires an itemized invoice for housing, you may use the housing form (Form 3). If you require additional/alternate documentation, please contact Reservation Agent, Kristen Hovermale.
- Swan Lake Resort will require a Credit Card Authorization (Form 2.2) to be completed along with the Lodging Reservation Form (Form 3). Credit Card must be presented upon arrival at the event.
- Form 1 is to be used to assist in determining your total costs for the event.

Once **ALL** forms have been submitted, your team's information will be passed along to Reservation Agent, Kristen Hovermale. Kristen will contact the school to make lodging arrangements.

NJCAA NETWORK

The 2026 NJCAA DII Men's Golf Championship will not be streamed on the NJCAA Network.

NJCAA CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ALL NJCAA MEMBER-SPONSORED EVENTS

This code of conduct applies to any and all contests/competition in which any NJCAA member college participates. Violations of the code of conduct occurring during the regularly scheduled season events shall be referred to the respective conference or region standards and ethics committee. The jurisdiction of the NJCAA Code of Conduct applies to all NJCAA member colleges and their representatives.

Code of Conduct

- A. Coaches and team personnel shall recognize the responsibility for proper conduct at any and all contests/competitions in which any NJCAA member college participates.
- B. Coaches shall recognize and assume responsibility for the actions of themselves and the team mem-



bers.

C. The Head Coach, assistant coaches (recognized on the roster and college website, and other non-student personnel (athletic trainers, athletic administrators) are allowed to enter the court or field area to assist with deterring a possible fight or to assist in breaking up an existing altercation. Individuals who escalate the existing situation or do not act in a professional manner, could be subject to penalties or sanctions. Each coach who has participants competing in the event shall be responsible for informing each participant about the Code of Conduct.

Behavior

Coaches, players and institutional personnel must remember that they are representatives of an institution of higher learning, its faculty, administration and student body. As such, they are expected to conduct themselves in a manner which would reflect positively on their team, institution, region and the NJCAA. Student-athletes, coaches and institutional personnel who are representing the NJCAA or NJCAA member colleges are subject to all NJCAA rules, regulations, and penalties as stated in the NJCAA Handbook, respective NCAA rulebook, as well as local, state and federal laws.

Inappropriate and unacceptable behavior by coaches, players or institutional personnel will not be tolerated before, during, or after contests; at the hotel, or in public while representing their college. This Code of Conduct does not replace NJCAA Policies Manual – Sportsmanship of the NJCAA Handbook. Unacceptable forms of behavior include, but are not limited to:

1. Fighting
2. Taunting
3. Inappropriate celebration
4. Disrespectful attitude toward opponents, officials, tournament administrators
5. Use of profane and vulgar language or language that refers to race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, and national origin and/or other threatening language.
6. Use of drugs and/or alcohol, tobacco (including but not limited to e-cigarettes, vaping, etc.)
7. Disrespectful attitude toward host hotel personnel
8. Unlawful activities
9. Physical abuse or damage to college property or host hotel property.

Derogatory Comments

A. Players, coaches and institutional personnel shall not make any derogatory public comments regarding contests, competitions or game officials at any time; in print, broadcast social media, news releases or any other communications where comments may become public. The head coach will be responsible for any derogatory comments or actions made by any player, coach, or institutional personnel.

B. A coach shall not address or permit anyone from making uncomplimentary remarks to any game official before, during, and/or after any and all NJCAA member contests/competitions in which any NJCAA member participates.

Reporting

Violations of the Code of Conduct shall be reported to:



1. To the respective Region Director for all regular season and region/district competition violations.
2. National Championship or Invitational violations shall be reported to the CEO/President of the NJCAA and to the Compliance Department at compliance@njcaa.org

Procedures - Immediate Action

Where immediate action is needed to alleviate or control a situation:

A. During regular season and/or the Region Tournament competition: The Region Director or Assistant Region Director shall have the authority to act at his/her sole discretion. During District and/or National postseason competition, the Tournament Director and/or on-sight Administrator shall have the authority to act at his/her sole discretion. Examples of events which would require immediate action include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Allegation of serious misconduct requiring immediate suspension of institutional personnel or student athletes from competition.
- Instances where the Executive Director or his/her designee deems it necessary to protect the equity and integrity of the competition.
- Protection of the event's officiating program, particularly in an instance where public comments by an institutional representative may affect competition.
- Any instance or circumstance which might affect the safety of officials, participants or spectators attending the event.

Penalties - Immediate Action

The Region Director or Assistant Region Director during regular season and/or Region Tournament competition and the CEO/President or his/her designee during District and/or National postseason competition may issue any penalty that he/she believes appropriate to any student-athlete or institutional personnel who has violated the regulations pertaining to conduct when the Region Director, Assistant Region Director, Executive Director or his/her designee concludes that immediate action is required. The actions of the Region Director or Assistant Region Director during regular season and/or Region Tournament competition and the CEO/President or his/her designee, during District and/or National postseason competition, shall be final and binding.

Penalties - Timely Action

Reprimand: The Region Director or Assistant Region Director during regular season and/or region tournament competition and the NJCAA CEO/President or NJCAA Board of Regents may issue a letter of reprimand to the coach, player or institutional personnel who violates the regulations pertaining to conduct. Copies of the letter of reprimand will be sent to the Director of Athletics, the President of the institution and the Region Director and/or National Office.

Probation, suspension, and other penalties: If the misconduct is serious enough, the Region Director or Assistant Region Director during regular season and/or Region Tournament competition and the CEO/President or his/her designee during District and/or National postseason competition may issue other penalties which may include, but are not limited to, probation, suspension or disqualification of the coach, player, team, or institutional personnel from participating in one or more contests.



TOURNAMENT POLICIES

- All NJCAA and USGA rules will be followed to the letter. It is every Coach's responsibility to be familiar with NJCAA Handbook, Section II, Bylaws of the NJCAA, Article XIII NJCAA policies are enclosed with this packet
- Players may be penalized for failure to observe the rules of etiquette of golf or NJCAA behavior policies. Improper behavior by tournament participants, as determined by the NJCAA Code of Conduct may result in disqualification. Coach's responsibility to be familiar with NJCAA Handbook, Section V, Article XX.
- Appropriate golf attire will be required. This applies for everyone representing a college at all official tournament functions.
- All Participants and officials staying in a hotel are encouraged to stay at the Swan Lake Resort hotel per NJCAA tournament rules. NJCAA Article XIII, Golf, Section 17.
- The Hotel is considered part of the tournament site and all behavior rules will be enforced. This includes a ban on alcohol and tobacco.
- The National Championships will be a no-cut tournament. All participants are expected to play through Friday and attend the awards ceremony.
- No players or coaches will be permitted to play on the tournament course from May 4-17. This does not include the Swan Lake Silver Course.
- Two designated coaches may give advice. These coaches must be designated prior to the beginning of the event. Both coaches must wear identification as provided by the tournament when on the course. Teams will only be provided (2) credentials for on course coaches/advice. Replacements/additional credentials will not be provided.
- Carts may be rented at the rate of \$25 per round per day. All carts must remain in the rough during tournament play, no exceptions. Any disruption in the play of golf by any coach or spectator in a cart will result in the suspension of all cart use.
- No contestant shall be permitted to enter the NJCAA Championship Golf Tournament unless accompanied by a coach or faculty member of their school or a designated supervisor, coach or faculty member from an NJCAA member college.
- Tee times will be set by NJCAA rule however; the rules committee reserves the right to reschedule times in the event of suspended play or other considerations.
- Scorecard procedures will follow USGA stroke play rules.
- USGA 5-3a will be followed with respect to tee time/time of starting.
- Players will be permitted to use electronic distance measuring devices on course during play provided they do not measure wind or elevation. Cell phone GPS applications may not be used. Violation will be disqualification from that round.

Competing players are allowed back onto the course after their round is completed to support teammates still finishing. These players must act in spectator capacity only and have no contact with players still competing. If found providing advice, appropriate penalties may occur. (This was changed effective last year but did not get updated in sport code.



SIX PLAYER SUBSTITUTION RULE

Qualification of Teams and Individuals for Competition - Men (Division I, II, III) & Women (Division I, II, III) A. During postseason play through the National Championship stroke play or match play, a team may substitute a sixth player for any member of the team, provided that:

1. The NJCAA Golf Tournament Director and/or the NJCAA Representative is notified of the substitution at least 10 minutes prior to that team member's starting time.
2. The sixth player is an eligible member of the institution's team. Note: When a team has substituted a sixth player, the substitution becomes final, 10 minutes prior to that team member's starting time and no further changes may be made by the team for that round. However, prior to the 10-minute mark, the team may withdraw the substitution by notifying the NJCAA Golf Tournament Director and/or the NJCAA Representative and may substitute for another player as provided above. The team member that was substituted for becomes the sixth player and the team is limited to that player, if the team wishes to substitute for a player prior to any subsequent Championship round.
3. Teams with only a single head coach and no other assistants may designate a student athlete from their team to act as an assistant coach during the post season. • If using a student athlete team member (7th man), this individual may not compete in the event. • If a team wishes to use their 6th man in an assistant coach capacity, at which point they act as an assistant for any round they then become ineligible at that point to participate further in the event and would not be able to be substituted into the lineup. (Ex. 6th man plays round 2 and coaches round 3, they would be ineligible to play round 4) • If the 6th man does not play in rounds 1-2-3, they could be used as the assistant in the 4th round if not selected to play.

Key Local Rules - Additional information will be provided in your coaches' packet, covered in the coaches meeting and covered on the daily supplied player's pins sheet and rule sheet

USGA Rules - USGA rules will govern all play unless modified Local Rules and Terms of Competition.

Use of Motorized Transportation - Model Local Rule G-6 is in effect. Players will walk during a stipulated tournament round except when a player who will play, or has played, under penalty of stroke and distance is always authorized to ride on motorized transportation from anyone. Penalty for breach of local rule- the player gets the general penalty for each hole where there is a breach, and on the next hole when the breach is between holes.

Pace of Play - In accordance with USGA Rule 5, the Tournament Committee has established the following pace of play guidelines for the purpose of preventing slow play. Pace of play guidelines will be enforced with checkpoints set up at the end of holes #4, #9, #14, and #18. Groups will be allotted 4 ½ hours to complete their round or 15 minutes per hole. At each checkpoint, your time will be marked. If the group is on or ahead of time, they will be flashed a green card, indicating proper pace of play. If the group is behind schedule, they will be flashed a red card indicating a first warning and will be urged to increase their pace of play. If the group is still behind pace at the next point, they may be subject to a one stroke penalty for each player in the group.

Stopping and Resuming Play - USGA 5.7b- A suspension of play for a dangerous situation will be signaled by one prolonged note of a siren/horn. All other suspensions will be signaled by three consecutive notes



of a siren/horn. In either case, resumption of play will be signaled by two short notes of a siren/horn. Players must discontinue play, mark their golf balls, and proceed to the clubhouse. You are not permitted to play additional shots, and/or finish your hole in the event of suspension of play. NO EXCEPTIONS! All practice areas will be closed during an immediate suspension for a dangerous situation until the Tournament Committee has declared them open. Players who practice on closed practice areas will be asked to stop, and failure to stop practicing may result in disqualification.

Advice - In accordance with USGA 10.2a, each team may appoint two persons who may give advice to members of the who may give advice to members of that team. Such person must be identified to the Committee before giving advice and be wearing proper identification at all times.

Spectators - Spectators are to remain 30 yards away from competitors and on the cart path or in the rough with no communication to players at any time. Spectators are to have cell phones in the off position. There will be no warning. Spectators violating this rule will be asked to leave the golf course property If their cell phone disrupts play.

Scorecard - After completion of play, players must proceed to the official scoring area near the scoreboard. All scorecards must be signed and attested before being turned into the scoring official. The scorecard is deemed to be returned once the player has left the scoring area. No alterations may be made to the scorecard after the player has left the scoring area. Penalty for breach of this condition is disqualification.

Use of Audio and Video Devices - Model Local Rule G-8 is in effect (modification to USGA Rule 4.3a). During a round, a player must not listen to or watch content of any nature on a personal audio or video device. Penalty for breach of local rule- see USGA Rule 4.3

Use of Certain Footwear - Model Local Rule G-7 is in effect. During a round, a player must not wear shoes with traditional spikes-having single or multiple points designed to penetrate deeply into the surface or spikes of any design that are entirely made of metal. Penalty for breach of local rule- see USGA Rule 4.3.

One Ball - The One Ball rule is not in effect.

Close of Competition - The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a prize ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Tournament Committee.

Practice Before or Between Rounds and Between Holes - The player must play without delay and in accordance with the pace of play guidelines set by the Tournament Committee. Between the play of two holes, a player must not make any practice stroke on or near the putting green of the hole just completed, or test the surface of that putting green by rubbing the putting green or rolling the ball. Additionally, a player must not practice on the competition course before or between rounds, other than the designated practice areas.

Temporary Immovable Obstructions - Model Local Rule F-23 is in effect. We will discuss balls striking power lines and towers in the coaches meeting.

Grove and Punch Mark Specifications - Model Local Rule G-2 is in effect.

Lists of Conforming Driver Heads - Model Local Rule G-1 is in effect. All players play the black tees.

Replacing a Club that is Broken or Significantly Damaged - Model Local Rule G-9 is in effect.

Use of Clubs Longer than 46 Inches - Model Local Rule G-10 is in effect.

List of Conforming Driver Heads – Model Local Rule G-1 is in effect.



List of Conforming Golf Balls - Model Local Rule G-3 is in effect.
